Degree Requirements

There are several milestones you need to complete prior to graduating:

1. Take and pass all of the coursework required for your degree and concentration.
2. File a Plan of Study (mid-point of your studies, by the third semester of coursework) via the interactive iPOS system located on your My ASU page. You should also have an approved supervisory committee.
3. Successfully pass written and oral comprehensive exams at the end of your coursework.
4. Successfully complete and defend a research paper prospectus (must be completed no later than the semester prior to the defense semester)
5. Successfully complete a dissertation culminating in an oral defense within ten years of admission.

Graduate Coursework

Every course taken for a doctoral degree must have a graduate course number (500+). You will not receive graduate credit for courses at the 400-level or below. You may take courses at the 400-level or below, but the courses will not count toward your degree. The courses are divided into three categories: Studies in Major Area, Other Studies in Music and Electives.

Studies in Major Area (60 credits)

AME XXX Core courses in consultation with the School of Arts, Media and Engineering faculty advisor (12 credits)

MTC 723 Composition (6 credits, three credits per semester for 2 semesters)

MTC 792 Research (9 credits in any combination over several semesters throughout coursework)

MTC 799 Dissertation (12 credits in any combination over several semesters throughout coursework)

Other Studies in Music - Musicology and Music Theory (21 credits)

You must take five courses at the doctoral level. Two courses (3 credits each) must be in musicology or ethnomusicology (MHL prefix). Two courses (3 credits each) must be in Music Theory (MTC prefix). 500-level courses that are double-listed as a 400-level course may not be used toward the MHL/MTC requirement. In special cases, a substitution may be allowed. Visit the [MHL + MTC Course website](#) for more information. MHL 532 Bibliography and MTC 525 Pedagogy of Music Theory must be completed at the doctoral level if it was not taken in the MM level. You must complete all MHL/MTC requirements before you are eligible to take your written and oral comprehensive exams.

Electives (9-11 credits)

The elective area of the check sheet allows you to customize the degree to meet your specific career interests and needs. Ensembles or additional lessons may count here. You may also take courses elsewhere on campus, as approved by your advisor, but must be at the graduate level to count towards your degree.

SAMPLE PLAN OF STUDY

Most students take three years (not including summers) to finish the degree. Here is a typical full-time plan.
