Degree Requirements

There are several milestones you need to complete prior to graduating:

- 1. Take and pass all of the coursework required for your degree and concentration. All work toward a doctoral degree must be completed within ten consecutive years of the semester of entry.
- 2. File a Plan of Study (mid-point of your studies, by the third semester of coursework) via the interactive iPOS system located on your My ASU page. You should also have an approved supervisory committee.
- 3. Successfully complete three recitals (as approved by your committee).



- 4. Successfully pass written and oral comprehensive exams at the end of your coursework.
- Successfully complete and defend a research paper proposal (must be completed no later than the semester prior to the defense semester)
- 6. Successfully complete a research paper culminating in an oral defense within ten years of admission.

Degree Timeline

All work towards a doctoral degree must be completed within ten consecutive years from the semester of entry.

Graduate Coursework

Every course taken for a doctoral degree must have a graduate course number (500+). You will not receive graduate credit for courses at the 400-level or below. You may take courses at the 400-level or below, but the courses will not count toward your degree. The courses are divided into three categories: Studies in Major Area, Other Studies in Music and Electives.

Studies in Major Area (63 credits)

MUP 727 Studio Instruction (16 credits, four credits per semester for four semesters)

MUP 751 Piano Literature (2 credits)

MUP 791 Seminar (3 credits)

MUP 507 Group Piano Practicum (2 credits)

MUP 581 Pedagogy (6 credits)

MUP 796 Solo Performance (12 credit hours, in any combination)

MUP 792 Research (12 credits in any combination over several semesters throughout coursework)

Master's level coursework in studio instruction and recitals (10 credit hours)

Other Studies in Music - Musicology and Music Theory (27 credits)

You must take five courses at the doctoral level. Two courses (3 credits each) must be in musicology or ethnomusicology (MHL prefix). Two courses (3 credits each) must be in music theory (MTC prefix). One theory course must be an analytical course. The fourth course must be in music theory but may be a non-analytical course. 500-level courses that are double-listed as a 400-level course may not be used toward the MHL/MTC requirement. In special cases, a substitution may be allowed for the MHL requirement. Visit the MHL + MTC Course website for more information. MHL 532 Bibliography must be completed at the doctoral level if it was not taken in the MM level. You must complete all MHL/MTC requirements before you are eligible to take your written and oral comprehensive exams.

Electives - Optional

The electives areas of the check sheet allows you to customize the degree to meet your specific career interests and needs. Ensembles or additional lessons may count here. You may also take courses elsewhere on campus as approved by your advisor. These credits will count in the "open courses" part of your plan of study.
