## Degree Requirements and Timeline

There are several milestones and requirements throughout the DMA program in addition to the required coursework listed above. All work towards a doctoral degree must be completed within ten consecutive years from the semester of entry.

# SAMPLE PLAN OF STUDY

Most students take three years (not including summers) to finish the degree. Course work can be completed in two academic years with careful planning. Here is a typical full-time plan.
