Degree Requirements

All work toward a master's degree must be completed within six consecutive years of the semester of entry.

- Complete the diagnostic exams in music theory and musicology before your first semester.
- Take and pass all of the coursework required for your degree and concentration.
- File a Plan of Study (second semester) via the interactive iPOS system located on your My ASU page. You should also have an
 approved supervisory committee by the end of your third semester. You must take and pass all of the coursework required for your
 degree
- Complete the Foreign Language Requirement
 - Successfully pass 1 Foreign Language Exam or designated reading course through the <u>School of International Letters and</u> <u>Cultures (approved by committee)</u>.
 - Students who are not proficient in a foreign language should enroll in coursework to prepare for the foreign language requirement. See the handbook for more information
- · Successfully pass written and oral comprehensive exams at the end of coursework.
- Successfully complete a thesis document culminating in an oral defense (within the six-year limit).
- Apply for Graduation in final semester.

Graduate Coursework Curriculum Breakdown

Every course taken for a master's degree must have a graduate course number (500+). You will not receive graduate credit for courses at the 400-level or below. You may take courses at the 400-level or below, but the courses will not count toward your degree. When courses are double listed under both 400-level and 500-level numbers, always take the 500-level section. Courses at the 600- or 700-level are usually for doctoral students and require permission from your faculty advisor and the instructor of the course. You may take 600-level courses, but check first with the instructor or your faculty advisor. The MA degree in Music is accredited through the National Association for Schools of Music (NASM) and meets the curricular requirements as indicated below.
