This degree requires 33 credit hours with a written comprehensive exam. Students have the option to choose either a thesis or an applied project and should consult the area coordinator and the handbook regarding which path is the best for them. Use this degree check sheet and guide to assist with filing your Plan of Study (required by the university) and to track your progress in your degree.

Clinical Cognate Area (6 credit hours)

This area constitutes an outside minor in a clinical application in music therapy. Students, with committee approval, will select two courses from one area. Cognate areas may include, but are not limited to, the following:

Degree Requirements and Timeline

All work toward a master's degree must be completed within six consecutive years from the semester of entry.

- Consult with your faculty on whether you should pursue the thesis track or the applied project track.
- Take and pass all of the coursework required for your degree.
- File a Plan of Study (mid-point of your studies, by the third semester of coursework) via the interactive iPOS system located on your My ASU page. You should also have an approved supervisory committee.
- Successfully pass written exam in the early part of your final semester and before your thesis defense (if you chose this track)
- An oral comprehensive exam may be required after your written comprehensive exam. Consult with your committee.
- Successfully complete a thesis (culminating in an oral defense) or an applied project.
- Apply for Graduation in your final semester of study.

Graduate Coursework

Every course taken for a master's degree must have a graduate course number (500+). You will not receive graduate credit for courses at the 400-level or below. You may take courses at the 400-level or below, but the courses will not count toward your degree. When courses are double listed under both 400-level and 500-level numbers, always take the 500-level section. Courses at the 600- or 700-level are usually for doctoral students and require permission from your faculty advisor and the instructor of the course. You may take 600-level courses, but check first with the instructor or your faculty advisor. The MM degree in Music Therapy is accredited through the National Association for Schools of Music (NASM) and meets the curricular requirements as indicated below.

Thesis Defense Timeline - Completed in your final semester (students on the thesis track ONLY)

Task/Milestone	Timeline
Review thesis defense timeline	By the end of the first week of class.
Final review of your Plan of Study	By second month of your final semester. Fix any course issues/committee updates.
Apply for Graduation	Oct. 1 for fall/Feb. 15 for spring/Jun. 15 for summer.
Submit final thesis draft to committee	At least three weeks before your thesis defense.
Pick a thesis defense date	Determine thesis defense date with committee (at least three weeks before defense date).
Chair submits the Defense request form	A minimum of three weeks before the defense date.
Schedule your defense in MyASU and upload document to your Plan of Study for format review	After receiving approval from the Office of Academic Affairs, schedule your defense at least 10 business days before your date.
Submit final format revisions to ASU Graduate College	For current semester deadlines and more detailed information, go to the MDT Graduate Student Resources canvas site for defense information.
