Tips on Selecting Coursework

Each semester, the courses offered in musicology (MHL) and music theory (MTC) are listed on the [MDT Graduate Student Resources site](#). Courses are offered on a rotational basis and are not necessarily offered every semester. The MTC courses are identified as either an analytical or non-analytical course.

Degree Requirements

All work toward a master's degree must be completed within six consecutive years from the semester of entry.

- Take and pass all of the coursework required for your degree and concentration.
- File a Plan of Study (mid-point of your studies, by the end of the second semester of coursework) via the interactive iPOS system located on your My ASU page. You should also have an approved supervisory committee.
- Successfully pass the Keyboard and Musicianship Exam by the end of the third semester.
- Successfully give two conducting recitals as approved by your committee.
- Successfully pass the written exam during the your final semester of study.

Graduate Coursework

Every course taken for a master's degree must have a graduate course number (500+). You will not receive graduate credit for courses at the 400-level or below. You may take courses at the 400-level or below, but the courses will not count toward your degree. When courses are double listed under both 400-level and 500-level numbers, always take the 500-level section. Courses at the 600- or 700-level are usually for doctoral students and require permission from your faculty advisor and the instructor of the course. You may take 600-level courses, but check first with the instructor or your faculty advisor.

Other Studies in Music (11-12 credit hours)

You must take four [MHL/MTC course](#) in total. Two courses (3 credits each) must be in musicology or ethnomusicology (MHL prefix). One course (3 credits) must be an analytical course in music theory (MTC prefix). The fourth course (2-3 credits) is also in music theory but may be a non-analytical course. If you plan to complete a doctoral degree at some point, you may wish to fulfill one of your musicology course requirements with MHL 532 Bibliography. You must complete at least three of your four [MHL/MTC requirements](#) before you are eligible to take your written comprehensive exam in your final semester of study.

Electives (0 credit hours)

These courses should be at least 500 or above and should be placed in the "open courses" section of your plan of study. You should work with your faculty advisor in determining coursework for this area.

Sample Plan of Study

Most students take two years (not including summers) to finish the degree. Here is a typical full-time plan.

Plan your recitals with your faculty advisor. Join a student group, chamber ensemble, etc. If planning to do a DMA, consider taking MHL 532 Bibliography (required for a DMA degree)

See the master's comprehensive exams website for exam dates and registration details. RSVP to graduation ceremonies through your MyASU. Order graduation regalia. Ask your committee chair to hood you at the ceremony. Students on an F1/J1 visa should register for at least 9 credit hours this semester. Students on federal aid should register for at least 9 credit hours this semester to be considered full-time.
