Academic Advising

Consult with the area coordinator for your faculty advisor assignment and they will assist you with coursework selection. The School of Music, Dance and Theatre Office of Academic Affairs will assist you with filing your plan of study.

MDT Graduate Student Resource Site

Tips on Selecting Coursework

Each semester, the courses offered in musicology (MHL) and music theory (MTC) are listed on the student canvas site. Courses are offered on a rotational basis and are not necessarily offered every semester. The MTC courses are identified as either an analytical or non-analytical course. Refer to the MDT Graduate Student Resources Canvas site for the most current list of course offerings.

Degree Requirements and Timeline

All work toward a master's degree must be completed within six consecutive years from the semester of entry.

- · Consult with your faculty on whether your should pursue the thesis path or the applied project path.
- Take and pass all of the coursework required for your degree.
- File a Plan of Study (second semester) via the interactive iPOS system located on your My ASU page. You should also have an approved supervisory committee.
- Successfully pass the written comprehensive exam in your final semester of coursework.
- An oral comprehensive exam may be required after your written comprehensive exam. Consult with your committee.
- Applied project students: successfully complete your applied project by presenting in front of your committee in the final semester. A
 grade of "B" or better is required for the project.
- Thesis students: successfully complete a thesis defense in the final semester.
- Apply for Graduation in your final semester of study.

Graduate Coursework

Every course taken for a master's degree must have a graduate course number (500+). You will not receive graduate credit for courses at the 400-level or below. You may take courses at the 400-level or below, but the courses will not count toward your degree. When courses are double listed under both 400-level and 500-level numbers, always take the 500-level section. Courses at the 600- or 700-level are usually for doctoral students and require permission from your faculty advisor and the instructor of the course. You may take 600-level courses, but check first with the instructor or your faculty advisor. The MM degree in Music Composition (interdisciplinary digital media) is accredited through the National Association for Schools of Music (NASM) and meets the curricular requirements as indicated below.

Sample Plan of study

Most students take two years (not including summers) to finish the degree. Some students may take up to three years with a thesis defense. Here is a typical full-time plan.
